Jean de Brébeuf was a Jesuit missionary, priest to the Hurons in Ontario. He wrote the Huron Carol in 1640 as a gift to the Huron people, in their own language. The Hurons respected Father Brébeuf because of his ease with their tongue, and his carol was gratefully accepted and passed down through the generations. Over 300 years later, the carol was translated into French by Father De Villeneuve, and it was not until 1926 that an English version was written by J. Edgar Middleton. The tune of the Huron Carol is based upon the 16th century carol, "Une Jeune Pucelle". (A Young Maid).
