The "first voice" begins and voices enter one by one. After the 5th voice enters, the remaining voices are subtracted one by one. "Jubilate" (sing for joy) is a popular word. If in doubt listen to Stephanie Martin's website.

Composer, teacher, church musician, Stephanie Martin has contributed to the Toronto's colourful music scene. As Artistic Director of Pax Christi Chorale since 1996, Martin has led numerous performances of the great works of the Oratorio repertoire. She received an honorary membership in the Elgar Society, and holds the distinction of being the first woman to conduct a full performance of Elgar's "Dream of Gerontius".

Martin served as Director of the Church of Saint Mary Magdalene in Toronto where she recently recorded the complete set of Henry Willan's "lost" manuscripts. Resident women's chant group Schola Magdalena sang "O Gracious Light".

As a student of music at York University, Martin holds degrees from the University of Toronto, and is an Associate of the Royal Canadian College of Organists.
