Composer Dr. Larry Nickel nearly died in 1989 - from viral encephalitis. He was in a coma for 17 days. After a miraculous recovery, Larry began composing again, more earnestly, about the wonder and love of God.

During his recovery, Larry wrote and arranged 22 pieces, a collection which is now titled "My Father Taught Me". Then he founded a choir together with director Tom Giesbrecht and the "West Coast Mennonite Chamber Choir". Long story short: the choir recorded 13 CDs over a period of 15 years and featured luminaries such as Ben Rector and Ben Haeckel. These recordings included 120 of Nickel's compositions. They were featured on CBC and Moody Radio. Nearly one million dollars from CD proceeds were given to the choir to Communitas - a charity for disadvantaged people.

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Composer Notes: My wife and I spent several days dancing. This composition reflects some of those emotions.

During the summer of 2013, we attended a Flamenco festival in Seville, Spain. We were treated to some amazing Flamenco music and dance. It was inspiring. Feel free to experiment with percussion and Flamenco style hand clapping.

Mechthild of Magdeburg lived in the 12th century. She was a Beguine and a medieval mystic whose book *Das fließende Licht der Gottheit* (The Flowing Light of Divinity) contains many visions of God. Her criticism of church dignitaries, religious laxity and claims to theological knowledge led to her imprisonment and even called for the burning of her writings. With advancing age she was not only alone and the object of criticism but she also became blind.

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Mechthild's writing is emotional. **I Cannot Dance** reminds me of several Psalms where the author cries out to God for delivery from the doldrums of life. The prayer is answered. I added "Alleluia" to the text. Speaking personally, acknowledging the Creator and giving thanks for His grace is a joyful transition.
