Hailing from the frozen northern town of Timmins, Ontario, precocious nine-year-old Pierre Massie won First Place in the local Kiwanis Festival in the vocal category. Starting University at 17, in 1980 he graduated with a Bachelor of Education from U. of Ottawa, majoring in music, percussion, and string instruments.

In 1977, while a student, Pierre founded The Stairwell Carollers. In his own words, he has had the honour and privilege of directing the choir ever since – unique in that Pierre

In 1987, Pierre started teaching for the Ottawa/Carleton School Board as lead music teacher at Osgoode Township High School in Metcalfe, and later in 2000 as Head of Fine Arts at Sir John A. Macdonald High School in Ottawa. He retired from teaching in 2014 and enjoys his time directing the Stairwell Caroller

Often, Pierre is taken by the composition muse and disappears into the back porch for hours at a time. Inspiration can be a storm, a mourning dove, or just the sound of the wind in the trees.
