These four hymns (among others) were precious to Mennonites for over 150 years. They are etched into my childhood memory - learning the alto line beside my mother at Fraserview MB Church during the late 1950's and early 1960's. Such music can sustain Christians through difficult times.

Molotschna was founded in 1804 by Mennonite settlers from Russia (Poland) and consisted of 57 villages. The Mennonites had been invited by the czar to develop the land because of their highly reputed agricultural skills.

The Russian revolution was not kind to the Mennonites. A Bolshevik wanted his horse. My great uncle was maimed and reading the bible when soldiers suddenly came to her house. She quickly covered the bible in dough and put it in a sack. My grandparents were just kids when their parents fled to Canada and took up home-steading close to the CN rail line. They lived in a house made of sod. Eventually, my Dad grew up on a farm in Saskatchewan, with 8 brothers and sisters. They spoke German in the home and learned English at school. By the time I came along, Mom and Dad used German only. I secrets in front of my three brothers and me. These little stories might put some perspective on this menno-medley.
