He is perhaps best known for his recordings by choirs and ensembles.

and a broad-ranging career as a composer, pianist, musicologist and choral director. He is perhaps best known for his recordings by choirs and ensembles. A composer of vocal and choral music whose works have been commissioned, performed and recorded by choirs and ensembles throughout North America.

Dr. Wright has a broad background in music theory, counterpoint, composition, choral arranging, music history and post-tonal music theory and analysis at Western University, McGill University, the University of Ottawa, and Carleton University, where he is currently a professor of music theory and composition. In 2019, James Wright was named University of Toronto Louis Applebaum Distinguished Professor (Composition). His three-movement chamber art song cycle, *Letters to the Immortal Beloved*, sets extracts from Beethoven's passionate and mysterious love letters of 1812, to a woman unknown. The cycle has been performed on five continents, and featured on the CD "Elements Eternal" (Naxos 8.573533) by Canadian mezzo-soprano Julie Nesrallah and the Gryphon Trio, and the CD "Immortal and Beloved" (Analekta B07LC2J7VG) by Luxembourg baritone David Daniels and the Gryphon Trio. His recent four-movement String Quartet, "Ellen at Scattergood," has been recorded by the Andante String Quartet of Montreal, and will be included on their forthcoming CD "Briller de mille feux" (Halifax: Leaf Music, 2022). American composer and reviewer Dr. John Cornelius II writes that "this is a brilliantly sophisticated work that has nothing to prove, except its composer's audacity."
