In Lightfoot, b. 1938, is a Canadian singer-songwriter who achieved international success it, folk-rock, and country music, and has been credited for helping define the folk-pop sound the 1960s and 1970s. He has been referred to as Canada's greatest songwriter and internationally as a folk-rock legend. His songs have been recorded by some of the world's most renowned recording artists, including Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, Hank Williams Jr., The Kingston Trio, Marty Robbins, Jerry Lee Lewis, Bob Dylan, Judy Collins, Barbra Streisand, Johnny Mathis, Richie Havens, Harry Belafonte, Sarah McLachlan, John Mellencamp, Peter, Paul and Mary, Glen Campbell, Anne Murray, The Irish Rovers and Olivia Newton-John. Robbie Robertson of The Band declared that Lightfoot was one of his "favourite Canadian songwriters and is absolutely a national treasure." Bob Dylan, also a Lightfoot fan, called him one of his favourite songwriters, and in an often-quoted tribute to his fellow songwriter, Dylan once observed that when he heard a Gordon Lightfoot song he wished "it would last forever."

Conductor, composer, pianist, organist and educator, **Mark Sirett** (b. 1952) is Founding Artistic Director of the award-winning Cantabile Choirs of Kingston, Ontario. Canada. He holds both masters and doctoral degrees from the University of Iowa and has taught at the University of Alberta, Western and Queen's. He has conducted honours choirs in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario and Nova Scotia and internationally in the US, South Korea and Luxembourg.
